

Ribbons Scarf



Measurements

Scarf measures (approx) 8cm x 120cm

Materials

Panda Ribbons 100g balls

Quantity 1

Use only the yarn specified. Other yarns are likely to produce different results.

- 1 pair 5.00mm (UK 6) knitting needles.
- sewing needle and matching thread.

Scarf

Remove the ball band, unfold the hank onto a table top, then remove all ties.

Wind **Ribbons** around the ball band (or a cardboard tube) so that yarn remains flat, without any twists or folds.

The edge with open boxes is the edge that is used for knitting.

If necessary, trim the end to remove any partial box.

To Cast On –

To create a neat edge, fold over the first 2 boxes so that they exactly overlap the next 2 boxes.

Holding a 5.00mm knitting needle in your right hand and the folded end of Ribbons in your left hand, slip each of the double boxes onto the needle (inserting needle from the back), then add 8 more single thickness boxes ... total of 10 stitches.

Swap needle with stitches to your left hand.

1st row – Insert right-hand needle in first st, wrap edge of next box around tip of right hand-needle and knit in the usual way, repeat for each stitch (working each doubled box as a single stitch).

Knit every row in this manner until almost all yarn is used up, leaving a minimum of 14 edge boxes for casting off.

Note – If you find a break or knot in the yarn and need to join in a new end – trim ends to remove any partial boxes, overlap ends by 3 complete boxes, then knit these as single boxes to complete the changeover.



To Cast Off –

Cast off first 8 stitches, fold end over to form double boxes (as before), then cast off next stitch.

Using needle and thread, sew final stitch securely to cast off edge.

To Make Up
